Measuring the impact of Pupil Premium

Progress 8 is the new Government headline measure, replacing 5 A* to C GCSEs including English and maths. It tells us how well pupils at a school have progressed between the end of primary school (key stage 2) and the end of secondary school (key stage 4), compared to pupils in other schools who got similar results at the end of primary school. Progress 8 is based on results in up to 8 qualifications, which include English, maths, 3 qualifications including sciences, computer science, history, geography and languages, and 3 other additional approved qualifications. The greater the Progress 8 score, the greater the progress made compared to the average of pupils with similar prior attainment.

Schools are now required to compare the outcomes for their disadvantaged pupils against the national outcomes for non-disadvantaged pupils (termed as 'others'). Results from Summer 2016 are shown in the table below.

Overall, the Progress 8 measure for disadvantaged students at SJS (+0.21) was higher than the national average for other students (+0.12).

Other performance measures include Attainment 8 which measures the average achievement across the eight subjects used in Progress 8; % achieving A* to C in both English & maths

Attainment 8 for disadvantaged students at SJS is similar to the national average for other students when looked at by prior ability band.

Low and high prior attaining SJS disadvantaged students achieve more than the equivalent national others in terms of % achieving A* to C in both English & maths

The above data demonstrates that the Pupil Premium money SJS has been used effectively to support our disadvantaged students.
