HERBs

HERBs assesses the attitude displayed by the student towards their learning. These attitudes are important because they set the required foundations for learning and often determine progress and eventual GCSE outcomes.

Lots of '1's: Keen to Learn. Active and Engaged Learner. Congratulations. You will make excellent progress and achieve well.

Lots of '2's: Generally wants to Learn. Engaged Learner. Well done. You have the right attitude and should make good progress.

Lots of '3's: Reminded to Learn. Compliant Learner. More effort and engagement needed if you are to make good progress. You should arrange an appointment with your tutor.

Lots of '4's: Reluctant to Learn. Non-compliant Learner. Your teachers have serious concerns over your ability to make even basic progress. You should arrange an appointment with your Head of Year as soon as possible.
