PARENT/CARER ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY



New technologies have become integral to the lives of children and young people in today's society, both within schools and in their lives outside school. The internet and other digital information and communications technologies are powerful tools, which open up new opportunities for everyone. These technologies can stimulate discussion, promote creativity and stimulate awareness of context to promote effective learning. Young people should have an entitlement to safe internet access at all times to enhance teaching and learning.

This Acceptable Use Policy is intended to ensure that:

- young people will be responsible users and stay safe while using the internet and other communication technologies for educational, personal and recreational use.
- parents and carers must be aware of the importance of e-safety and are involved in the education and guidance of young people with regard to their on-line behaviour.
- school ICT systems and users are protected from accidental or deliberate misuse that could put the security of the systems and users at risk.

Sir James Smith's Community School will try to ensure that students will have good access to ICT to enhance their learning and will, in return, expect the students to agree to be responsible users. Please read the Student Acceptable Use Policy so that you are aware of the school's expectations of your child while in our care.
